Let's Get Dramatic

A further thank you to the Parent Council who were successful in their application for a grant from the local neighbourhood partnership.

This £1,800 or so worth of funding is for:

- (1) a Polytunnel for the gardening club
- (2) More drama lunchtime club sessions
- (3) Lego Therapy training

We are delighted that Edinburgh Youth Theatre have confirmed they can deliver a lunchtime drama club for the next 10 weeks. This will be offered to pupils in P4/5 and will take place on Thursday lunchtimes. This along with Lego club, Gardening Club, P3 Book Club and all the lunchtime Active Schools Provision means that there is a great deal on offer across lunchtimes for anyone who wants to try something different/take a break from the playground.
