Then the units 6 and 4 which is 10. I add 80 and 10 together which is 90. $36+54=90$)</p> <p>Write the instructions for one of our maths games using dice, dominoes, cards or tally rally.</p> <p>Write down three pieces of information that you can gather from reading a bar chart. https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/51/bar-charts</p>	<p>Write a letter to someone.
